



Evaluation of Applicants for WDA Graduate Student Research Recognition Award

I. Summary

- 1) Title: The title accurately reflects the work performed in the study.
- 2) Abstract: The abstract is clear and concise and accurately reflects the study.
- 3) Introduction: The introduction provides sufficient background and clearly states study hypothesis(es) and objectives.
- 4) Materials and Methods: Methods are adequate to test hypothesis(es) and address objectives of the study.
- 5) Results: Results (including tables and figures) are presented clearly and agree with methods of the study.
- 6) Discussion: Conclusions and discussion are sound, logical, supported by the data presented, and do not extrapolate unnecessarily. Discussion should cover management implications of research, where appropriate.
- 7) References: Appropriate references are included and cited to support factual statements in the manuscript, without redundant citations.

II. WDA Objectives

Research meets WDA objectives.

III. Letter from advisor

Letter of recommendation indicates the advisor is well versed in the student's research and that a majority of the research was conducted on the student's personal initiative.

IV. Disqualifications

Summary is >10 pages, excluding tables, figures, and references.
