



## BioOne Ambassador Program

### Description and Application Guidelines 2022

Established in 2018, the annual BioOne Ambassador Awards recognize early career researchers who effectively communicate the importance and impact of their research to the public. The Wildlife Disease Association (WDA), as a partner publisher of BioOne, is allowed to nominate up to three individuals yearly to participate in the BioOne Ambassador Awards competition.

Those chosen must currently be students or be within 5yrs. post completion of their primary or secondary degree and have published in the Journal of Wildlife Diseases within the previous calendar year. Nominees are judged on their ability to write a 750-word plain language essay or produce a video explaining the importance of their published research.

Winners receive a \$1,000 award from BioOne and wide dissemination of their research summary.

#### Application process:

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Be a current graduate student or early career researcher who received a graduate degree, DVM or equivalent, PhD or master's, within the last five years.
- Have published an article as an author in the Journal of Wildlife Diseases during the previous calendar year.
- Be a current member of the Wildlife Disease Association.

Applicants must submit a 750 word, plain-language essay or video explaining their published research. They are specifically judging an applicant's ability to explain to the public ***How does your research change the world?*** What are the real-world implications and importance of your work at a local or global level? Nominated individuals will further work with the BioOne Ambassador Award program manager to polish their essay or video content.

#### The Award:

The three individuals nominated by WDA will each receive a \$250 award which can be used for fees, books, supplies, equipment, and other educational expenses incurred by you as a student during the pursuit of your graduate degree, or to support travel to conferences, plus 1-year's WDA membership (Student or Regular Member Worldwide Online).

If a winner(s) is chosen by BioOne for an Ambassador Award, they will receive an additional award of \$1,000 (USD) from BioOne along with the promotion of their work on the JWD and BioOne websites. They will also receive a total award amount of \$1,000 from the WDA. This award may be used for fees, books, supplies, equipment, and other educational expenses incurred by you as a student during the pursuit of your graduate degree, or to support travel to conferences, plus 1-year's WDA membership (Student or Regular Member Worldwide Online).



If you would like to be considered for a WDA nomination to BioOne for this science communication award, please send:

- A copy of your published manuscript.
- A 750-word, plain-language essay, or video in MP4 format or a password protected link to your video on *How does your research change the world?* When thinking about how to draft your essay or video, think about the language you might use to describe this work to a family member.
- The year and institution where you received your DVM, PhD or master's degree.
- Your current affiliation.

**Deadlines:**

December 15, 2021– February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022: Solicitation of submissions from WDA authors.

February 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022: Three WDA nominee applications submitted to BioOne.

February 25<sup>th</sup> - March 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022: Selected nominees can continue to polish their Applications to BioOne. These must be submitted to BioOne by March 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022.

April 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022: Winners publicly announced.
