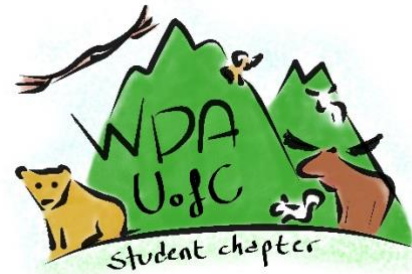

The UCalgary WDA Student Chapter has a strong collaborative relationship with the University of Calgary – Faculty of Veterinary Medicine’s Wildlife Health Ecology Research Group (WHERG). We are also connected closely with the Ecosystem Public Health Club through the UCVM – DVM program. This year we have had a great collaboration with the One Health Research Group, especially with the One Health Over Hops group for public outreach/science storytelling.
- If your chapter collaborates, what does the chapter do together with the other organization?
The UCalgary WDA Student Chapter has worked closely with the WHERG, organizing and advertising monthly seminars by researchers in wildlife-related fields, receiving funding for snacks and refreshments for monthly meetings, and organizing and attending an annual WHERG/WDA Student Chapter Retreat in Lake Louise, Alberta. We include the University of Calgary Veterinary Medicine (UCVM) Ecosystem Public Health club’s listserv in all WDA communications. One Health Over Hops events are featured in WDA meetings.

Ken Mori led a discussion on his paper which is in the final phases of journal submission. Paper titled *Modeling the epidemiology of tropically transmitted parasites with complex life-cycle in a complex landscape: an agent-based modeling approach*.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

All WHERG activities have been paused as of November 2019 as a result of budgetary changes and restrictions. All WDA Calgary events of 2020 have been led by Emma Vaasjo, Diana Jeong, and Mason Stothart, until June 2020, in which the coordinators are Emma Vaasjo and Filip Rakic. The format of WDA Calgary has been changed from monthly journal clubs to a weekly writing group and monthly discussions on up-to-date wildlife disease research, back to a monthly journal club in June 2020, joining a rotation of faculty-wide journal clubs at the UofC. All monthly journal clubs are hosted through Zoom/online platform until further notice. Annual retreat/workshop for WHERG and WDA pending.
